Multiple award-winning jazz star from Denmark, Sinne Eeg, is captivating audiences around the world.

Concertgoers are mesmerized by this swinging Danish songstress' confident intonation, her strong rhythmic sense, and her talent for phrasing and scatting, all with natural, perfect pitch and a dark, Scandinavian smoothness in her voice.

Sinne has a rare ability to empathize and is not afraid

to take chances on stage. This can be experienced in joyful extravaganza in both her phrasing and her superior scat improvisations. Eeg is a masterful interpreter of the American Songbook as well as a highly skilled composer, evident in her beautiful compositions. Add Sinne's legendary good mood and the complete concert experience is guaranteed.

Eeg has released 11 albums under her own name, 5 of which have been awarded a Danish Music Award Jazz for Best Vocal Release of the Year. In addition, Sinne has received a multitude of awards and recognitions, including The Ben Webster Prize, Queen Ingrid's Honorary Legacy as well as the Palmares Award for International Vocal Release of the Year, voted by the French jazz critics.

DAC MAKES NEWS IN JYLLANDS-POSTEN

A group of first, second, and third generation Danes/

discussions in general are perceived both here and in
Denmark. It was a great conversation that highlighted
the somewhat humorous old saying "When you get three
Danes in a room, you get four opinions." Mr. Ullerup's

in print and online on Friday, August 30.



THE DANEBO READING CIRCLE TRAVELS BACK IN TIME AND SPACE

Sunday, October 20: 2pm
The book that the Danebo
Reading Circle will discuss in
October explores the times
and adventures of the Viking
Age. The Far Traveler: Voyages
of a Viking Woman, by Nancy
Marie Brown (USA, 2007:
Harcourt, 306 pages) is a well-



researched retelling of the life of Guðrið Þorbjarnardóttir (Gudrid Thornbjarnardottir). The hybrid meeting (Third Floor North Commons and Zoom) will begin at 2pm and

end no later than 4pm on Sunday, October 20.

Barb Andersen will lead the discussion of this hardy woman's life and place in the sagas. As described in the book listing on the library website: "Five hundred years before Columbus, a Viking woman named Gudrid sailed off the edge of the known world. She landed in the New World and lived there for three years, giving birth to a baby before sailing home. Or so the Icelandic sagas say. Even after archaeologists found a Viking longhouse in Newfoundland, no one believed that the details of Gudrid's story were true. Then, in 2001, a team of scientists discovered what may have been this pioneering woman's last house, buried under a hay field in Iceland, just where the sagas suggested it could be. Joining scientists experimenting with cutting-edge technology and the latest archaeological techniques, and tracing Gudrid's steps on land and in the sagas, Nancy Marie Brown reconstructs a life that spanned--and expanded--the bounds of the then-known world. She also sheds new light on the society that gave rise to a woman even more extraordinary than legend has painted her and illuminates the reasons for its collapse."

At the October meeting, members will also finalize the list of books for 2025. If the results of the first ballot in September require tweaking, a final ballot will be cast in October. Then members will decide on dates and leaders for the final list of eight titles so that bookmarks and other calendar items can be ready by the next meeting. Many thanks to Mary Beth Lake and her selection team!

On Sunday, November 17, Mary Beth will lead the group's final book discussion in 2024: Olav Audunssøn III: Crossroads by Sigrid Undset (NO, 1925, translated 2022 by Tiina Nunnally: University of Minnesota Press, 242 pages). Mary Beth provided this description from the book jacket: "Crossroads, the third of Olav Audunssøn's four volumes, finds Olav heartbroken by loss and further estranged from his son. To escape his grief, Olav leaves his home estate of Hestviken and agrees to serve as captain on a small merchant ship headed to London. Questioning past decisions and future plans, he must grapple with his perceptions of love and guilt, sin and penitence, vengeance and forgiveness. Conveying both the intimate drama and epic sweep of Olav's story, Crossroads summons a powerful picture of Northern life in medieval times." Praise for the series included this quote from the Wall Street Journal: "This is an absorbing, psychologically rich tale that promises to go deeper and more memorable with each successive volume." Kirkus Reviews awarded Crossroads with a Starred Review, describing it as: "Shrouded in sorrow and Scandinavian gloom and a central part of a masterwork of modernist literature."
