### NOTES FROM THE PRESIDENT

Once again I'm writing my president's letter while traveling. This time, I'm on a family trip to lowa. Our son, Rasmus, has graduated from the University of Minnesota and we are helping him relocate to the site of his first 'real job.' We are on a mission to find him a safe and comfortable place to live as he begins this new chapter in his life.

In an effort to improve the safety and comfort at the DAC, we've had an ongoing focus on upgrading our DAC property, and we have several projects underway or in the planning stages. Our new building entry system has been installed and is now active. This system was installed in an effort to make our premises more secure, yet still enable access for our guests and members. The new system will allow our regular groups to have unique keypad codes for building access. The system also allows our on-site staff the ability to unlock the doors remotely.

Another welcome improvement will be repaving the parking lot on the west side of our building. The existing surface had aged beyond repair and was long overdue for resurfacing. Prior to resurfacing, the boundaries will be modestly increased to add additional parking spaces on that side of our building.

Our property's landscaping is getting rejuvenated, thanks to a generous gift of labor and materials from the Jensen family. The landscape plan was approved last fall, and the work commenced in September of 2024. Most of the focus of the new plan is on the east side of our property, facing the river parkway. New edging, plants, and landscape features will greatly improve the appearance of our property. As the landscaping project nears completion, a new irrigation system will be installed to help us maintain the health and appearance of our lovely new landscaping and yard.

We are in the planning stages for our first floor improvements. The addition of new restrooms adjacent to the Kaffestue will make our property more comfortable and accessible for all of our guests. The plans are being drawn and the early bids are coming in now for our subcontracting work.

These are good, long term investments in the safety, comfort and utility of our DAC property. I am grateful to everyone who has contributed their time and effort to these projects!

# THE DANEBO READING CIRCLE PLANS AHEAD FOR FALL

With five interesting books and good discussions behind them, members of the Danebo Reading Circle will be using June, July, and August to enjoy some summer activities that just might include books, especially those with which they will finish off the year. They will also be submitting final nominations for the 2026 calendar.

Anyone may propose titles for that process by providing genre, title, author, country of origin, translator, publication and translation dates, publisher, page count, a short description, and format and availability information (print, eBook, audiobook; libraries, bookstores, online, etc.). The deadline for submitting nominations is September 8. Group deliberations and voting take place during the fall meetings. It really is a democratic process!

The choices for the remaining three Sunday meetings in 2025 (September 21, October 19, and November 16) are *Out Stealing Horses* by Per Petterson (NO, Oslo: Forlaget Oktober, 2003, 258 pages; translated by Anne Born, New York: Picador, 2005); *The Old Man and His Sons* by Heòin Brú (Faroes: Varòin, 1940, and Sprotin, 2012; translated by John F. West, New York: Paul S. Eriksson, 1970, and London: Telegram, 2011, 166 pages); and *Animal Life* by Auòur Ava Ólafsdóttir (IS: Benedikt, 2020, 192 pages; translated by Brian FitzGibbon, New York: Black Cat [Grove Atlantic], 2022). Bookmarks with the 2025 schedule are available on the table outside the DAC Library on the first floor.

The September meeting will begin at 1 pm and end by 3pm, in time for the DAC Annual Meeting (3-6 pm) that day. It will follow the usual hybrid format with members meeting on the third floor of the DAC and also on Zoom. October and November hybrid meetings will run 2-4pm.

### **BOUND FOR A DISTANT SHORE**

HERITAGE GALLERY ART EXHIBITION

Open through October 2025

The DAC was thrilled to receive a very special work of art from member Ruth Palm and the Palm family. The "Amy of Copenhagen," a brigantine, or two masted sailing ship model, serves as the centerpiece of a new exhibition featuring ships from the collection of the DAC, now on view in the Heritage Gallery. This intricately detailed ship was carved with a doctor's scalpel by Ruth's grandfather, Captain

Frederik Ernst Funder

(1857-1910). Beginning





in 1885, Captain Funder carved the model during his free time while serving on a sailing ship. Life as a captain took Captain Funder all over the world, and in Lebanon he conceived the idea and procured a limb of a tree to begin carving the model ship. Named after his daughter Amy who was born in 1881, the model saw completion in 1888. The rigging is made of homespun linen.

The "Amy of Copenhagen" is accompanied by paintings and decorative arts that show how important the sea and ships are to Danish culture. From Viking ships to fishing, from contemporary recreational sailing vessels to container ships for world trade, the sea is central to Danish culture and identity. Denmark's geographic position gives it control of the Danish straits (Skagerrak and Kattegat), linking the Baltic and North Seas.

The 19th century painting "Danish Ship off the Coast of Helsingør" illustrates how this geography gave Denmark historical international stature. Another favorite work of art in the collection is the Tin Advertising Sign for Thingvalla, Scandinavian Lines of the Ocean Liner Fredrik VIII. This steamer, built in 1913, ferried many Scandinavian immigrants to the US. Our exhibit will remain on view through October, so visit the next time you are at DAC.

# NJÁL'S SAGA TAPESTRY EXHIBITION

August 15-19
DAC and Icelandic
Hekla Club will
be exhibiting a
traveling version
of The Njál
Saga Tapestry
modeled after



the Bayeux Tapestry, a Viking-themed tapestry from Northern France that tells the story of the Norman Invasion of Britain in 1066. Like the Bayeux "Tapestry," the Njál's Saga Tapestry is not truly a tapestry, since tapestries are woven on looms. The Njál's Saga Tapestry is a long embroidery, entirely hand-stitched in the Bayeux-style on pure woven linen, using Icelandic wool, hand dyed with local plants. The Njál's Saga Tapestry recounts a local story of 10th and 11th century embattled Vikings, created and embroidered in the heart of Njál's Saga country, on the Rang River plain, in the town of Hvolsvöllur, South Iceland. Njál's Saga, or more accurately, The Saga of the Burning of Njál, is considered Iceland's mightiest saga. Its story and characters are woven into the fabric of Icelandic culture and the saga is read every year, on the same day, from start to finish in the schools and libraries of Iceland. Programs include two talks by curator Claudia Petursson, on Friday night August 15 and Sunday, August 17 and an embroidery workshop Saturday, August 16. Details will be announced on the DAC website as they develop this summer.
